Has a PhD in Information Systems from the London School of Economics (LSE), London, and an MBA in Information Management from the UCP in Lisbon. Professor Assistant at the School of Human Sciences (FCH) of UCP, he is senior researcher at CECC and a member of the Scientific Board of FCH. He was the first Coordinator of PhD program in Communication Sciences of FCH and he coordinated as well for several years the Master program in the same area at FCH. Since 2004 he supervised around one hundred master, PhD and Post-doc researches at the FCH.

He authored seven books and more than twenty peer reviewed papers, published in leading academic houses such as Oxford University Press, Wiley, Springer, Elsevier, Macmillan, De Gruyter, INCM - Casa da Moeda. His main research areas are (i) the philosophy of communication and information, and (ii) communication and leadership.
