Iguana (Helping schools overcome resistance to change) is a multi-stakeholder collaborative research and development project initiated by CEPCEP, a research centre of the Portuguese Catholic University, and Arcola Research in London. Since 2012, this partnership has brought together the Tavistock Institute in London, Ellinogermaniki Agogi in Athens, The Institute of Mathematics and Informatics in Vilnius, Trinity College in Dublin, Contour Education Services in Surrey, the European School Heads Association and many school leadership associations across Europe.

The aim of the project is to research, develop and create innovative resources for overcoming resistance to change when innovating schools.


